SNAMP: **Sierra Nevada Adaptive**

Management Project

Anne Lombardo represents an ongoing University of California forest study on the effects of fuel treatments (forest thinning) on forest, water, and wildlife health. They are known as the Sierra Nevada Adaptive Management Project or SNAMP. They have two sites in a seven-year-long study. The southern one is near Bass Lake. Now five years into their work, they are striving to bring transparency and neutrality to their efforts with public workshops and outreach. Anne is the southern site representative to the Public Participation Team, one of 6 teams working together on this multi-disciplined study of the effects of fuel treatments in our National Forests.
